Rich Meyer will introduce Sharon Hoogstraten, Citizen Potawatomi photographer, and "Dancing for our Tribe," her project documenting Potawatomi cultural life today as seen through pow-wow regalia. We will have information on the September commemorative caravan retracing the Trail of Death.

Rich Meyer is a local historian of the early 1800's, and a navigator for the Potawatomi Trail of Death.

Sharon Hoogstraten, a member of the Citizen Potawatomi Nation and professional photographer, has spent a decade creating formal portraits of fellow Potawatomis. This legacy project spans all nine Potawatomi Nations and is our gift to the future seven generations.

Glenn Gilbert spent over 30 years working at energy efficiency and sustainability practices at Goshen College. Recently he has been a proponent of solar photovoltaic systems and is interested in finding ways that we can all have a lighter energy footprint in this critical time.

Edible Forest Tour

Luke Gascho

Luke will lead a tour of his 2.5-acre fruit, nut and berry orchard. He will explain how this orchard is an example of regenerative agriculture. Participants will learn about the strengths of a polyculture design, how soil health is nurtured, and the holistic way pests are managed. The group will consider the opportunities to promote resilient food systems.

Dr. Luke Gascho served as executive director of Merry Lea Environmental Learning Center of Goshen College, Wolf Lake, Indiana for 22 years until his retirement in 2019. During his tenure, he led the implementation of field-based undergraduate programs, a Master of Arts in environmental education program and the Institute for Ecological Regeneration. Luke regularly speaks on the concepts of creation care, leadership, ecological food systems and repairing relationships with Indigenous people. Luke enjoys visiting family, camping and tending his 2.5-acre urban farm in his retirement.

THURSDAY, JUNE 8

Regenerative Creation Care

Luke Gascho

The presentation will examine faith concepts that call everyone to care for creation. There are many challenges to Earth's systems resulting from consumerism and shortterm thinking. Paying attention to the interconnection of all things – people, ecosystems, soil, water, air and climate – is essential for the renewal that is needed. Participants will understand how the key terms of sustainability, regeneration and resilience provide a framework for healing the Earth, as well as examples of actions that are being taken.
