Hell in A Handbasket: Views of the Afterlife from Homer's Odyssey to C.S. Lewis's Screwtape Letters

What happens after we die? People have wondered about the afterlife, from the earliest pre-Christians to contemporary thinkers. In this class, we will explore classics like Homer's Odysse; apocalypses (revelations about the afterlife) from the early centuries of Christianity; Dante's Divine Comedy; and C. S. Lewis's The Screwtape Letters. Judith Davis, Professor Emerita of Fren ch and Humanities, is retired from Goshen College. She has taught Lifelong Learning classes on the Virgin Mary and on the New Testament Apocrypha, among others.

This spring, the Theater Department at Goshen College will present "Rent," a musical loosely based on Giacomo Puccini's opera "La Bohème." "Rent" won the 1996 Tony Award for Best Musical and the 1996 Pulitzer Prize for Drama.

The story takes place in the late 1980s and early 1990s, when friends in Manhattan's East Village struggle to build the lives of their dreams. Pennilessness, substance abuse, HIV/Aids, social tension, and political unrest, among other hardships, challenge the group physically and emotionally. Facing the problems head-on, they make personal self-discoveries and find what really matters most in life.

Together, we will examine themes through the music and dialogue, understand their correlations to the opera "La Bohème,"and learn about the show to better enjoy the production. The class will have the opportunity to visit Umble Center to talk with the production staff and enjoy a free brush-up rehearsal. Marcia Yost will teach this class.
